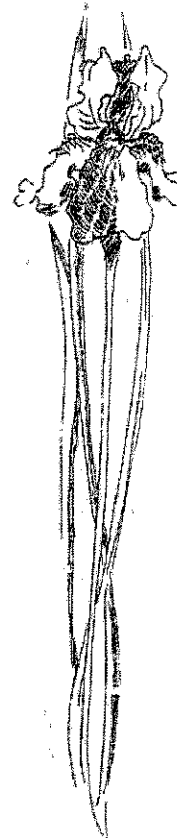

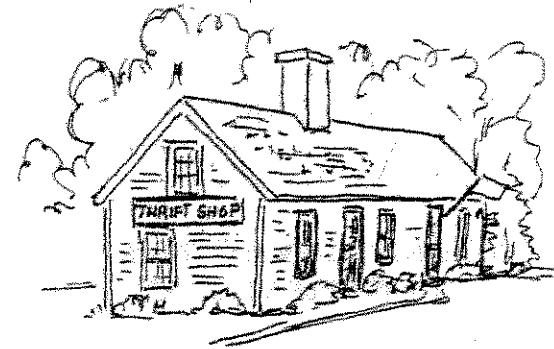

### BACKGROUND

The North Andover Thrift Shop was founded on April 1, 1955 by the Women's Alliance of The North Parish Church in order to finance its new educational wing. The Thrift Shop became a non-profit organization in 1984. Its first goal having been accomplished in seven years, it was then decided to continue the shop as a means of helping good causes within the community. That same goal continues today.

Originally located in the Brick Store Building in North Andover's Old Center, it relocated to 33 Johnson Street in November 1983. A fire in February 2000 left it without a home until May 2002, when it reopened in its present location, the historic Scholfield Mill at 172 Sutton Street.



### ABOUT THE SCHOLFIELD MILL

The Scholfield Mill was purchased by James Scholfield in 1802. Part of the little building was used as a weaving room. The water power from Cochichewick Brook enabled a carding machine, the third such in the country. By 1812 the property had become part of the Sutton Mill holdings, owned by Eben Sutton. In the 1950s the building was used to sell wool remnants from the Sutton Mill. It is now owned by the Town of North Andover and is leased by the Thrift Shop.
